CHAP. 104

St. Mary's College, for repairs	4,000.00
Robert W. Traip Academy, for maintenance	500.00
Washington Academy, for maintenance	1,000.00
Westbrook Seminary, for maintenance and for purpose of liquidating present indebtedness	2,500.00

Chapter 104.

Resolve, Appropriating Money to Increase the Salmon on the Maine Coast.

Salmon, for purchase of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars for each of the fiscal years nineteen hundred and twenty-four and nineteen hundred and twenty-five, for the purchase of salmon by the commissioner of inland fish and game, under the direction of the governor and council, the said salmon to be tagged and liberated in the rivers of the state above the dams to breed naturally and remain the property of the state so long as they live. Any person having tagged salmon in his possession shall be fined one hundred dollars for each salmon, said fine to be recovered by complaint, indictment or action of debt.

Chapter 105.

Resolve, in Favor of the University of Maine.

University of Maine, maintenance, etc. Resolved: That for the purpose of maintaining the University of Maine, throughout the period of the fiscal year beginning with the first day of July in this present year, there hereby is appropriated the sum of four hundred sixty thousand dollars for maintenance, and for the fiscal year dating with the first day of July in nineteen hundred twenty-four, there is appropriated hereby the sum of four hundred thirty-five thousand dollars for maintenance.

The word "maintenance," as that term is used in this resolve, shall be read and construed as inclusive of those items, only, which, in the official listings of the state, are grouped under the headings of Personal Services, Maintenance, Repairs and Equipment, Interest, and of New Construction and Permanent Improvement.

Chapter 106.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Purpose of Operating the Fish Hatcheries and Feeding Stations for Fish, for the Protection of Fish, Game and Birds and for Printing the Report of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game and Other Expenses Incident to the Administration of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Department of inland fisheries and game. Resolved: That the sum of three hundred and seventy thousand dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated, as follows:

One hundred and eighty-five thousand dollars for the period between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and one hundred and eighty-five thousand dollars for the period between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game for the purpose of operating the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish in the state, for the protection of fish, game and birds, for printing the report of the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, for maintenance of the state museum, for screening lakes and ponds, payment of bounty on bob cats killed in this state and all other expenses incident to the administration of the department of inland fisheries and game, and that any of this appropriation unexpended at the end of either year shall be available for the following year.

Chapter 107.

Resolve, Calling to the Attention of the Governor the Failure of the Legislature to Enact an Act Entitled, "An Act to Amend Sections One and Three of Chapter Three Hundred Fifty of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen, Relative to the Hours of Employment of Women and Minors."

Hours of labor of women and minors. Resolved: That whereas an act entitled, "An Act to Amend Sections One and Three of Chapter Three Hundred Fifty of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen, Relative to the Hours of Employment of Women and Minors," having been proposed upon petition by not less than twelve thousand electors, and the governor requested therein to issue his proclamation referring the proposed act to the people at a special election to be held not less than
