Chapter 112.

Resolve, for the Purpose of Correcting an Error in the Resolve for Laying of the County Taxes for the Year Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three as Applying to the County of Cumberland.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, an error appears in the resolve, for the laying of the county taxes for the year nineteen hundred and twenty-three, in that the figures as applying to the county of Cumberland are in error as not being in accord with the return as filed by the county commissioners of said county, and whereas the original resolve was an emergency measure because of the reasons therein set out and in the judgment of this legislature these facts constitute an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore,

County tax, 1923. Resolved: That the resolve, for the laying of the county taxes for the year nineteen hundred twenty-three, as enacted by the house, March 22, 1923, and by the senate, March 23, 1923, and signed by the governor, March 24, 1923, be and hereby is amended by striking out the words "two hundred sixty-four thousand, two hundred eleven dollars" and the figures "264,211.00" after the word "Cumberland" and substituting therefor the words 'two hundred twenty-five thousand one hundred fifty-one dollars' and the figures '225,151.00,' so that said resolve, as amended, shall read as follows:

STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED
AND TWENTY-THREE.

Resolve, for the Laying of the County Taxes for the Year Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Whereas, the several counties hereinafter named have certain expenses and liabilities which must be met as they become due, and such counties have no source of revenue except the taxes herein mentioned, therefore, the appropriations called for in this resolve are immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the judgment of this legislature these facts constitute an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it, therefore,

Resolved: That the sum annexed to the counties in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the year nineteen hundred and twenty-three.
