Chapter 4.

An Act to Amend Section Twenty-three of Chapter Nine of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Preparation and Publishing of an Annual List of Corporations Delinquent in Payment of Their Franchise Taxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 9, sec. 23; relating to publication of annual list of delinquent corporations, amended. Section twenty-three of chapter nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "three" in the eighth line of said section where said word is placed between the word "in" and the word "places," and substituting therefor the word 'four,' and inserting in the ninth line of said section after the word "namely" the word 'Lewiston,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 23. Lists to be published in four papers including one in Lewiston. The secretary of state shall annually prepare a list of all corporations that have failed to pay their annual franchise tax for the preceding year, giving the corporate name, the name of the treasurer last filed in the office of the secretary of state, and the amount of the tax due from each corporation, except those from which by reason of having been duly excused as provided by statute, or dissolved by decree of court, no franchise tax is due for such year, which list shall be published three times for three consecutive weeks in the month of August in four places within the state, namely, Lewiston, Bangor, Portland and Augusta, in such newspapers in each place as the secretary of state may select. If any corporation so advertised shall fail to pay all franchise tax due the state for such year, and the expenses of advertising the same, on or before the first day of December following, its charter shall be suspended, and such corporation shall have no right to use the same.'

Chapter 5.

An Act Increasing the Amount to be Paid for Clerk Hire in the Office of the Recorder of the Municipal Court of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; P. L., 1917, c. 42; 1921, c. 219; relating to clerk hire in county offices, amended. Section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter forty-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen as amended by section forty-five of chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth paragraph thereof after the words "Portland Municipal Court"

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the words "Sixteen hundred and twelve" and inserting in place thereof the words 'nineteen hundred and seventy-six' so that said paragraph four of said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Clerk hire in office of recorder of Portland municipal court, increased. Cumberland County; for clerks in the office of register of deeds, thirty-eight hundred and fifty-two dollars; deputy register of deeds, eleven hundred and forty-four dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, thirty-two hundred and seventy-two dollars; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, forty-three hundred and twenty-four dollars; for clerks in the office of recorder of the Portland Municipal court, nineteen hundred and seventy-six dollars; for clerks in the office of county attorney, seven hundred and forty-two dollars; for clerks in the office of sheriff, seven hundred twenty-eight dollars; for clerks in the office of county treasurer, seven hundred and twenty-eight dollars.'

This act became a law without the signature of the governor.

Chapter 6.

An Act to Amend Section Four of Chapter One Hundred Thirty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three, Relating to the Control and Suppression of the European Corn Borer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. L., 1923, c. 134, sec. 4; relating to penalty for violation of quarantine regulations against European corn borer, amended. Section four of chapter one hundred thirty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and substituting in place thereof the following:
- 'Sec. 4. Penalty decreased and made applicable to sec. 2. Whoever violates any quarantine regulations established by the commissioner of agriculture under section two of this act and whoever neglects or refuses to comply with the requirements of section three of the same shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars.'

Chapter 7.

An Act to Authorize the Filing by the United States in the Several Counties of this State Notices of Liens for Taxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Lien notices for internal revenue taxes may be filed in county
