Sec. 2. Penalties for violation of provisions of act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than three hundred dollars and costs for each offense, or imprisonment for sixty days, or both said fine and imprisonment.

Approved March 23, 1925.

Chapter 36.

An Act Relating to Teachers' Pensions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 16, sec. 170; relating to teachers who may receive a pension of \$200, amended. Section one hundred and seventy of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the sixth and seventh lines thereof, the words "two hundred dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'two hundred and fifty dollars,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:
- 'Sec. 170. Amount increased to \$250. Any person of either sex who, on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for thirty years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal occupation and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of the preceding section shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of two hundred and fifty dollars.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 16, sec. 171; relating to teachers who may receive a pension of \$150, amended. Section one hundred and seventy-one of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out in the seventh line thereof, the words "one hundred and fifty dollars," and inserting in place thereof the words 'two hundred dollars,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:
- 'Sec. 171. Amount increased to \$200. Any person of either sex who, on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for twenty-five years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal occupation, and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of section one hundred and sixty-nine shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of two hundred dollars.'
