CHAP. 157

the words "Oleomargarine sold or used here," or the name of substitute displayed on the placard instead of the word oleomargarine, such placard to be displayed at all times exposed in such conspicuous place as to be readily seen by any and all persons entering such hotel dining room, restaurant, boarding house, lunch room or lunch cart, where oleomargarine or other substitutes, is served.'

Approved April 7, 1925.

Chapter 157.

An Act Relating to Fishing for Smelts in Eastern River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Taking of smelts in tidal waters of Eastern river, prohibited. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in the tidal waters of Eastern river, a river lying in the counties of Lincoln and Kennebec, except by hook and line.

Sec. 2. Penalty. Whoever violates the provision of this section shall pay a fine of not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars and costs for each offense.

Chapter 158.

An Act to Prohibit the Catching of Smelts in the Cathance River Except by Hook and Line.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Taking of smelts in tidal waters of Cathance river, regulated. No smelts shall be caught, taken or fished for in any way other than by hook and line, except in nets of two-inch mesh or more, in the tidal waters of Cathance river above the iron bridge in the village of Bowdoinham in the county of Sagadahoc.

Sec. 2. Penalty. Whoever violates the provisions of section one of this act shall pay a fine of one hundred dollars for each offence.

Sec. 3. Inconsistent acts repealed. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith, so far as the same relates to this act, are repealed.
