CHAP. 107

seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen shall investigate and pass upon all matters pertaining to the pensions of policemen, in accordance with the provisions of this act, and shall have authority to grant such pensions as provided herein.

'**Sec. 26. Pensions, how and when paid.** The pensions specified in this act shall be paid monthly by the city treasurer of the city of Lewiston, and no pension shall be allowed unless application therefor shall be made to the board of police commissioners.

'**Sec. 27. Compulsory retirement in certain cases; chief of police not included in provisions of act.** Any member of said police department who hereafter reaches the age of sixty years, and who has served not less than twenty-five years, shall be retired on his petition, and thereupon become entitled to the benefits of this act, provided however that no provision of this act shall be construed to include the chief of said police department.'

Chapter 107.

An Act to Appropriate Moneys for the Expenditures of the Government and for Other Purposes for the Year from July First, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-five to June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-six.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriations July 1, 1925 to June 30, 1926. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of moneys from the state treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes, for the current fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, and except where otherwise specially provided, the governor with the advice of the council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.
