CHAP. 21

in the following schedule is hereby granted as a tax on each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and for other purposes of law, for the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Chapter 21.

Resolve, To Appropriate Money for Co-operative Agricultural Work between the College of Agriculture of the University of Maine and the United States Department of Agriculture.

Co-operative agricultural work between U. of M. and U. S. Department of Agriculture. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the University of Maine for co-operative agricultural work between its college of agriculture and the United States department of agriculture, as such work is defined in an act of the congress of the United States, approved May eighth, nineteen hundred and fourteen, entitled "An Act to provide for co-operative agricultural work, between the agricultural colleges in the several states receiving the benefits of an act of Congress, approved July second, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, and acts supplementary thereto, and the United States Department of Agriculture," for the fiscal year to begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the

sum of forty-nine thousand, two hundred seventeen dollars and seventy-six cents, made up of state Smith-Lever regular thirty-seven thousand, three hundred sixty-nine dollars and four cents, and Smith-Lever supplementary eleven thousand, eight hundred forty-eight dollars and seventy-two cents, and for the fiscal year beginning July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, the sum of forty-nine thousand, two hundred seventeen dollars and seventy-six cents, made up of the Smith-Lever regular thirty-seven thousand, three hundred sixty-nine dollars and four cents, and Smith-Lever supplementary eleven thousand eight hundred forty-eight dollars and seventy-two cents.

Chapter 22.

Resolve, Authorizing the Forest Commissioner to Sell and Convey a Certain Interest of the State in Township One, Range Seven, Penobscot County.

Forest Commissioner authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner is hereby authorized to sell and convey, consistently with the rights of others therein, to Eugenia A. Powers, an actual settler on township one, range seven, west from the east line of the state, in Penobscot county, Maine, certain lands in said township one, range seven, constituting part of the school lots of said township, if he deems advisable, for such price per acre and on such terms of payment as he may deem advantageous; provided, that the proceeds of any sales made shall be added to the school fund of said plantation.

Chapter 23.

Resolve, In Favor of Lester D. Eaton, Warden of the State Prison.

Lester D. Eaton, to reimburse for money paid to prisoners. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of five thousand six hundred ninety-seven dollars and eighty-five cents, and a further sum of ninety-four dollars and ninety-six cents, being five months interest at four per cent from February thirteenth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, on the first-named amount, and amounting in all to five thousand seven hundred ninety-two dollars and eighty-one cents to reimburse Lester D. Eaton, the warden of the state prison, for money paid out to the prisoners of the institution under orders of the governor and council, dated April first and October twenty-fourth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
