Chapter 28.

Resolve, in Favor of Zebedee Cushman of Kennebunk for an Increase of Pension.

Zebedee Cushman, increase of state pension. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of ten dollars per month beginning January first nineteen hundred and twenty-five and a like amount each succeeding month, to be paid to Zebedee Cushman of Kennebunk, which payment shall be in lieu of any other state pension now provided by law.

Chapter 29.

Resolve, Providing for an Increase of State Pension for Helen B. Hobart of Farmington.

Helen B. Hobart, increase of state pension. Resolved: That the pension of eight dollars per month granted to Helen B. Hobart of Farmington by chapter one hundred and seven of the resolves of nineteen hundred and thirteen, be and hereby is increased to twenty dollars per month, beginning January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, which payment shall be in lieu of any other state pension now provided by law.

Chapter 30.

Resolve, in Favor of Louis Nason of West Gardiner for State Pension.

Louis Nason, state pension. Resolved: That there be paid to Louis Nason of West Gardiner, the sum of eight dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, beginning January one, nineteen hundred and twenty-five and continuing for two years.

Resolve, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Ada M. Cowan of Sidney.

Ada M. Cowan, increase of state pension. Resolved: That there be paid to Ada M. Cowan of Sidney, daughter of a civil war pensioner, a pension
