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**CHAP. 32**

of fifteen dollars per month, payable quarterly, beginning January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature until otherwise ordered, which payment shall be in lieu of any other state pension now provided by law.

Approved March 25, 1925.

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**Chapter 32.**

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Mary C. Kimball, of Carmel.

**Mary C. Kimball, state pension. Resolved:** That a pension of ten dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mary C. Kimball, of Carmel, to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

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**Chapter 33.**

Resolve, to Increase the State Pension of Annie M. Welch, of Kennebunk.

**Annie M. Welch, increase of state pension. Resolved:** That the pension of six dollars per month granted to Annie M. Welch of Kennebunk, under the provisions of chapter fifty-six of the resolves of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, be hereby increased to eight dollars per month, beginning January one, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, which payment shall be in lieu of any other state pension now provided by law.

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**Chapter 34.**

Resolve, in Favor of Adelaide France of Sedgwick for State Pension.

**Adelaide France, state pension. Resolved:** That the sum of twelve dollars per month be paid to Adelaide France of Sedgwick in the county of Hancock, widow of a civil war pensioner, in quarterly installments from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, from January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, until otherwise ordered by the legislature.
