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and railroad bridge across the Kennebec river, between the city of Bath and the town of Woolwich?"

And the inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question, those in favor of the amendment voting "Yes" upon their ballots and those opposed to the amendment voting "No" upon their ballots and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and return made to the office of the secretary of state in the same manner as votes for governor and members of the legislature and the governor and council shall count the same and if it shall appear that a majority of the inhabitants voting on the question are in favor of the amendment, the governor shall forthwith make known the fact by his proclamation and the amendment shall thereupon as of the date of said proclamation become a part of the constitution.

Ballots to be provided by secretary of state. Resolved: That the secretary of state shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots and blank returns in conformity with the foregoing resolve accompanied by a copy thereof.

Chapter 72.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for Repairs and Improvements to State Fish Hatchery Buildings, Grounds and Equipment at Lake Megunticook, in Camden, County of Knox.

Lake Megunticook, state fish hatchery, improvements. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to be expended for repairs and improvements to the state fish hatchery buildings, grounds and equipment at Lake Megunticook, in the town of Camden, in the county of Knox, the same to be expended under the direction of the commissioner of inland fisheries and game. If this appropriation is not expended during the year nineteen hundred and twenty-five, it shall be available during the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Chapter 73.

Resolve, Relating to the Celebration of the Sesquicentennial Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence.

Sesquicentennial of declaration of independence, committee for observ-

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ance of. Resolved: That a joint special committee of the eighty-second legislature be appointed to arrange for the sesquicentennial, or one hundred and fiftieth, anniversary of the declaration of independence, who, with the governor and council, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives, are hereby directed to take such measures as to them may seem fitting for a proper observance and celebration of said anniversary.

Chapter 74.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Frank H. Taylor, of Whitefield.

Frank H. Taylor, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Frank H. Taylor, of Whitefield, to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 75.

Resolve, to Appropriate Money for the Purpose of Operating Fish Hatcheries and Feeding Stations for Fish, for the Protection of Fish, Game and Birds and for Printing the Report of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game, and for Maintenance of the Maine State Museum and for Other Expenses Incident to the Administration of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Department of inland fisheries and game, appropriations. Resolved: That the sum of three hundred and seventy thousand dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated, as follows:

One hundred and eighty-five thousand dollars for the period between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, and one hundred and eighty-five thousand dollars for the period between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game for the purpose of operating the fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish in the state, for the protection of fish, game and birds, for printing the report of the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, for maintenance of the Maine state museum, payment of bounty on bob cats killed in this state, and all other expenses incident to the administration of the department of inland fisheries and game, and that any of this appropriation unexpended at the end of either year shall be available for the following year.
