Amounting to twenty-five thousand, three hundred and thirty-five dollars and fifty-five cents, for the year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six; and twenty-five thousand, three hundred and thirty-five dollars and fifty-five cents, for the year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the sub-divisions above named and not required for the purpose may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be transferred by the governor and council to pay bills against any of the above sub-divisions where bills may have been contracted in excess of the amount above set forth.

Chapter 77.

Resolve, To Appropriate Money to Aid in the Screening of Certain Lakes and Ponds.

Screening lakes and ponds. Resolved: That the sum of fifteen thousand and fifty dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to aid in screening the following named lakes and ponds. Provided, however, that no appropriation hereafter specified for the erection of a screen at the outlet of a lake or pond shall be available until some responsible corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake or pond to be screened is situated, or some other town in the county in which said waters are situated, shall have, in

legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same, and provided, further, that said appropriation shall not be available until the citizens of the county in which said lake or pond to be screened is situated, shall have paid into the state treasury the balance necessary, as found by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to erect said screen; and provided, further, if the actual cost of any screen provided for in this resolve is less than the amount appropriated therefor, the state shall be liable for only one-half of the cost of such screen. Any appropriation hereinafter named, or part thereof, not expended during the year nineteen hundred and twenty-five shall be available during the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

For screening the outlet of Cathance lake, which lake is situated in the town of Cooper and in Township Fourteen, E. D., in the county of Washington, four hundred dollars \$400.00

For screening the outlet of Kennebunk pond, in the town of Lyman, in the county of York, seventy-five dollars 75.00

For screening the outlet of Hot Brook lake, in the town of Bancroft, in the county of Aroostook, eight hundred dollars 800.00

For screening the outlet of Bog lake, in the town of Northfield, in the county of Washington, three hundred dollars 300.00

For screening the outlet of Onawa lake, in the town of Willimantic, in the county of Piscataquis, one thousand dollars 1,000.00

For screening the outlet of Sebec lake, in the town of Sebec, in the county of Piscataquis, five thousand dollars 5,000.00

For screening the outlet of lake Moxie, in the county of Somerset, two thousand dollars 2,000.00

For screening the outlet of Schoodic lake, in Township Four, Range Eight, in the county of Piscataquis, five hundred dollars 500.00

To aid in repairing the screen at the outlet of Wilson lake, in the town of Wilton, in the county of Franklin, five hundred dollars 500.00

For screening the outlet of Hayden or Wesserunsett lake, so-called, in the town of Madison, in the county of Somerset, seven hundred and fifty dollars 750.00

For screening the outlet of Stetson pond, in the town of Stetson, in the county of Penobscot, two hundred dollars 200.00

For screening the outlet of Pennamaquam lake, which lake is situated wholly or partly in the town of Charlotte, in the county of Washington, five hundred dollars 500.00

For screening the outlet of Cobbosseecontee lake, in the county of Kennebec, twenty-five hundred dollars 2,500.00

For screening Sheepscot river, in the town of Palermo, in the county of Waldo, near the outlet of Sheepscot Big Pond, so-called, five hundred and twenty-five dollars 525.00

Chapter 78.

Resolve, in Favor of Western Maine Sanatorium, for Maintenance, Personal Services, Repairs and Equipment.

Western Maine Sanatorium, maintenance, etc. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Western Maine Sanatorium for the fiscal year from July first nineteen hundred and twenty-five to June thirtieth nineteen hundred and twenty-six, one hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars and for the fiscal year from July first nineteen hundred and twenty-six to June thirtieth nineteen hundred and twenty-seven the sum of one hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars; of said sums there shall be applied in each fiscal year for maintenance seventy-two thousand and five hundred dollars, for personal services forty-seven thousand and five hundred dollars, and for repairs and equipment fifteen thousand dollars.

Chapter 79.

Resolve, in Favor of State School for Girls.

State school for girls, maintenance, etc. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated for the state school for girls for the fiscal year July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, inclusive, the sum of eighty-three thousand five hundred and six dollars and fifty-nine cents for the purposes hereinafter specified, namely:
