Chapter 120.

Resolve, in Favor of Clerks, Stenographers and Messengers of the Several Committees, and Other Expenses of the Eighty-second Legislature.

Chapter 121.

Resolve, in Favor of a Bridge Over the St. Croix River Between Vanceboro, Maine, and St. Croix, New Brunswick.

International bridge at Vanceboro, in aid of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the state highway and bridge loan funds, the sum of seventeen thousand five hundred dollars to be available from the date of the passage of this resolve until June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, for the purpose of aiding in the construction of an international highway bridge across the St. Croix river between some point within the limits of the town of Vanceboro, in the county of Washington and state of Maine, and the parish of St. Croix, in the county of York and province of New Brunswick.

Provided that the expenditure of this amount shall not be made unless
