of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-five is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth line thereof the words "said waters," and inserting in place thereof the words 'Lake Cobbosseecontee in the county of Kennebec,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 3. Daily limit under general law in so far as relates to Lake Cobbosseecontee, not affected. This act shall not be construed as repealing that portion of the existing general law establishing a daily limit of fifteen pounds of white perch or not exceeding twenty-five white perch which may be taken in any one day in Lake Cobbosseecontee in the county of Kennebec.'

Chapter 84.

An Act to Name the State Park at Kittery, in the County of York.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

State park at Kittery named **John Paul Jones Memorial Park**. The state park at Kittery, situate between Hunter Avenue and Newmarch Street and between Water and Government Streets in the town of Kittery, county of York, shall forever be known and designated as "John Paul Jones Memorial Park" in memory of the commander of the first American warship.

Chapter 85.

An Act Relating to Salary and Expenses of the County Commissioners of Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 42, as amended; relating to salaries and expenses of county commissioners, amended. Section forty-two of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and seventy-three of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as amended by chapters two hundred and fourteen and two hundred and forty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, as amended by chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, as amended by chapter one hundred and three of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and as amended by chapter thirty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-five is hereby further amended by striking out the words "three hundred and fifty" in the twelfth line of said section and inserting
