As Passed by the Eighty-third Legislature

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and in all cases, the officer making service shall make a return of his service on the bill or subpoena, libel, notice of foreclosure, citation or other precept, without charge or fee for so doing.

Constables entitled to same fees. For any of the above enumerated services which a constable may legally perform, he shall receive the same fee as is provided for deputy sheriffs.

Inconsistent acts repealed. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

#### Chapter 108.

An Act Relating to Fees of Deputy Sheriffs in Attendance Upon the Courts. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 118, sec. 5; P. L., 1919, c. 222; 1919, c. 244; 1921, c. 205; relating to fees of sheriffs and their deputies, amended. Chapter one hundred and eighteen, section five, of the revised statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and twenty-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, as amended by chapter two hundred and forty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, as amended by chapter two hundred five of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is hereby further amended by striking out in the fourth line thereof the word "four" and inserting in place thereof the word 'five,' so that said chapter, as amended, shall read as follows:

Per diem for attendance at court, increased. 'Every deputy sheriff and court messenger while in attendance upon the supreme judicial court or the superior court in their several counties shall receive for said attendance and service five dollars a day; and the sheriff, at its opening, shall present to the court, a list of the officers attending, with the statement of the duties of each; and the court shall determine the number necessary, and disallow charges for others.'
