Chapter 236.

An Act Relating to the Salary of the Judge of Probate for Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 38; as amended, relating to salaries of judges of probate, further amended. Section thirty-eight of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "Oxford, twelve hundred and fifty dollars," in the thirteenth line thereof and inserting in place thereof the words, 'Oxford, fifteen hundred dollars,' so that said thirteenth line, as amended, shall read as follows:

Oxford county increased. 'Oxford, fifteen hundred dollars.'

Chapter 237.

An Act to Increase the Salary of the Clerk of Courts in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 40; as amended; relating to salaries of clerks of courts, further amended. Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in line nine after the word "Franklin" the words "fifteen hundred dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'seventeen hundred fifty dollars,' so that said line nine of said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Franklin county increased. 'Franklin, seventeen hundred fifty dollars.'

Chapter 238.

An Act Relating to the Salary of the Judge of Probate of Knox County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 38; as amended; relating to salaries of judges of probate, further amended. Section thirty-eight of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "eight hundred dollars" in the eleventh line,
