Chapter 241.

An Act Relating to the Increase of the Salary of the County Attorney for York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 37; as amended; relating to salaries of county attorneys, further amended. Section thirty-seven of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in the nineteenth line thereof, the words "fourteen hundred dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'sixteen hundred dollars,' so that said section so far as it relates to the salary of the county attorney for York county, as amended, shall read as follows:

York county increased. 'York, sixteen hundred dollars.'

Chapter 242.

An Act Relating to the Salaries of the County Commissioners of Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 42; as amended; relating to salaries of county commissioners, further amended. Section forty-two of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out after the word "Franklin" in the eighth line of said section, the words "four hundred fifty dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'five hundred dollars,' so that the eighth line of said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Franklin county increased. 'Franklin, five hundred dollars.'

Chapter 243.

An Act Relating to the Salary of the Treasurer of Knox County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 44; as amended; relating to salaries of county treasurers, further amended. Section forty-four of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in line eleven after the word "Knox" the words "four hun-
