## CHAP. 260

to exceed fifty dollars for each offense,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 22. **Penalty for dealers using bottles that do not comply with provisions of section twenty, fixed.** Any manufacturer who sells milk or cream bottles to be used in this state that do not comply as to size and markings with the provisions of the two preceding sections, shall forfeit five hundred dollars, to be recovered by the attorney-general in an action upon the bond of such manufacturer. Any dealer who uses for the purpose of selling milk or cream jars or bottles purchased after the third day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, that do not comply with the requirements of section twenty of this chapter as to markings and capacity shall be deemed guilty of using false or insufficient measures and punished by a fine not to exceed fifty dollars for each offense.'

**Sec. 3. Inconsistent acts repealed.** All acts or parts of acts inconsistent, herewith, are hereby repealed.

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## Chapter 260.

An Act to Increase the Amount to be Paid for Clerk Hire in the Office of the Clerk of Courts in the County of Cumberland.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; as amended; relating to clerk hire in county offices, further amended. Section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "forty-three hundred and twenty-four" in the fourth line of paragraph four of said section, and inserting in place thereof the words 'fifty-one hundred and twenty-four,' so that paragraph four, as amended, in so far as it relates to the annual amount to be paid for clerk hire in the office of the clerk of courts in Cumberland county, shall read as follows:

**Allowance for clerk of courts, Cumberland county, increased.** 'For clerks in the office of clerk of courts, fifty-one hundred and twenty-four dollars.'
