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fees for pilotage, whether their services are accepted or not, provided a pilot boat is on her station and prepared to furnish a pilot to such vessel; a pilot boat shall no be obliged to remain on her station at all times; every outward bound vessel, except as above provided, shall, whether their services are accepted or not, be held to pay the regular fees to the pilot who brought her in, or if no such pilot, then to the pilot first offering his services; a pilot shall have a lien for his pilotage fees on all vessels liable therefor. Persons desiring a branch shall make written application to said board, stating their qualifications therefor; and the said board shall make careful examination and investigation of the qualifications of the applicant, and if satisfied that he has the requisite qualifications, may give the applicant a branch under the hands of its members and the seal of the board, authorizing such person to act as pilot for the term of five years from the date of his appointment; and thereafter, said board may from time to time, renew the same.

'Said branch may be revoked at any time by said board, for negligence, incapacity, or for any other reason that said board may deem sufficient. The branch, so granted, shall be recorded by the clerk of said board in a book kept for that purpose, entitled "Pilots for the Port of Portland"; and the clerk shall receive from the applicant, for making such record, the sum of five dollars.'

Chapter 25.

An Act to Annex a Portion of Frenchville to Saint Agatha.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Part of Frenchville annexed to Saint Agatha. All that part of Frenchville in the county of Aroostook, which is described and bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at the southwest corner of lot number eighty-eight at the point of division of the town lines of Saint Agatha and Madawaska, on the shore of Long Lake, thence running southeasterly along the easterly shore of said lake to township numbered seventeen, range four, thence running westerly by the northerly line of said township to the line of Saint Agatha, thence along the easterly line of Saint Agatha to the point of beginning, together with the inhabitants thereof, are hereby set off from said town of Frenchville and annexed to said town of Saint Agatha and said inhabitants shall enjoy the same rights and be subject to the same requisitions as the town of Saint Agatha.
