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TAKING OF ALEWIVES IN ORLAND.

CHAP. 30

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Oquossoc Angling Association, for the purpose of angling, propagating fish and shooting game; with power to hold by purchase, lease or otherwise, real and personal property, and to lease, sell and convey, or otherwise dispose of the same; to adopt a code of by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of this state, and to do and perform such other acts and things as may be necessary for the promotion of the objects of the organization.'

Chapter 30.

An Act Relating to Taking Alewives in Eastern Penobscot River in the Town of Orland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1903, c. 367, sec. 3; relating to taking of alewives in eastern Penobscot river in Orland, amended. Section three of chapter three hundred sixty-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three is hereby amended by striking out all of said section, and substituting in place thereof the following section:

'Sec. 3. Town by vote may authorize taking of fish for period of five years. Any of the alewives in said river above a point five hundred yards below the lower dam may be taken by the town of Orland on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays of each week from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of July, if the town so votes at its annual meeting. The town may vote at any annual meeting to so take said fish for a period of not exceeding five years in succession.'

Chapter 31.

An Act Relating to the Property of Extinct or Disbanded Congregational Churches, Parishes or Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1893, c. 447, sec. 1; relating to power of Congregational Church Building Society over property of extinct and disbanded churches. Section one of chapter four hundred forty-seven of the private and special laws of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three is hereby amended by striking out the whole of section one of said chapter and inserting in place thereof the following, so that said section as amended shall read as follows:
