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CHAP. 105

shall not be required to prepare for posting or the city clerk to post a new list of voters, and for the purpose of registration of voters said board shall be in session the three secular days next preceding such elections, the first two days thereof to be devoted to registration of voters, and the last day to enable the board to verify the corrections of said lists and to complete and close up their records of said sessions. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the act to incorporate the City of Belfast School District be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross placed over the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. The result in said district shall be declared by the municipal officers of the city of Belfast and due certificate filed by the city clerk with the secretary of state.

Sec. 9. Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved and action is taken by the special election provided for.

Chapter 105

An Act Amending the Charter of the Belfast Water District so as to Authorize the Refunding of Bonds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1919, c. 96, sec. 8; relating to authority to issue notes and bonds, amended. Section eight of chapter ninety-six of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred nineteen is hereby amended by inserting in said section after the semi-colon at the end of the fourth line and before the words "of paying any necessary expenses" which commence the fifth line the following words: 'and for refunding any bonds heretofore or hereafterward issued at any time by the said Belfast Water District, or heretofore or hereafterward issued at any time by the Belfast Water Company and assumed by the Belfast Water District;'; so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 8. Authorized to issue bonds to refund bonds becoming due. For accomplishing the purposes of this act, said water district, through its trustees, is authorized to borrow money temporarily, and to issue therefor the interest-bearing negotiable notes of the district; and for the purpose of refunding the indebtedness so created; and for refunding any bonds heretofore or hereafterward issued at any time by the said Belfast Water District, or heretofore or hereafterward issued at any time by the Belfast

Water Company and assumed by the Belfast Water District; of paying any necessary expenses incurred in the creation of the district; in acquiring the properties and franchises of the Belfast Water Company; of securing sources of supply; taking water and land; paying damages; laying pipes; constructing, maintaining and operating a water plant; and making renewals, extensions, additions and improvements to the same, the said water district, through its trustees, may from time to time issue bonds of the district to an amount necessary therefor in the judgment of the trustees. Said notes and bonds shall be legal obligations of said water district, which is hereby declared to be a quasi municipal corporation within the meaning of section one hundred and five of chapter fifty-one of the revised statutes, and all the provisions of said section shall be applicable thereto. The said notes and bonds shall be legal investments for savings banks.'

Chapter 106

An Act Relating to the Town of Gorham.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town of Gorham authorized to unite with other towns to build highway. For the purpose of completing a continuous highway from the town of Alfred, in the county of York, to the Ossipee Trail, so-called, in Gorham, in the county of Cumberland, said town of Gorham is authorized to unite with the towns of Alfred, Waterboro, Hollis, and Buxton under the provisions of chapter one hundred fifty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen, and to raise and appropriate money as therein provided:

Said union, so constituted, shall be entitled to receive from the state, the apportionment as provided in said chapter and be subject to all the provisions thereof.

Any funds not used in the construction of the road leading from Gorham to Standish, in the towns of Gorham, Standish and Sebago, now in process of construction under said act, shall be transferred to be used upon said continuous highway leading from Alfred to the Ossipee Trail.
