## CHAP. 3

**Chapter 3.**

Resolve, in Favor of the Lincoln County Fair Association for the State Stipend for  
Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-two.

**Lincoln County Fair Association, payment of claim. Resolved:** That there be paid to the Lincoln County Fair Association one hundred forty-five dollars and twenty-three cents for the state stipend for the year nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Approved February 11, 1927.

**Chapter 4.**

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Lincoln for Reimbursement of Support of  
Virginia Brewer.

**Lincoln, town of, payment of claim. Resolved:** That there be paid to the town of Lincoln for reimbursement for support of Virginia Brewer, state pauper, the sum of one hundred three dollars and fifty-nine cents.

Approved February 12, 1927.

**Chapter 5.**

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Bar Harbor to Reimburse It for Support of Ida  
M. Bates, State Pauper.

**Bar Harbor, town of, payment of claim. Resolved:** That there be paid to the town of Bar Harbor to reimburse it for support of Ida M. Bates the sum of one thousand thirty-five dollars and fifty cents.

**Chapter 6.**

Resolve, in Favor of Henry Moore for Breaking and Shoveling Snow in Unorganized  
Territory, Winter of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-two and Nineteen Hundred  
and Twenty-three.

**Henry Moore, payment of claim. Resolved:** That there be paid to Henry Moore for breaking and shoveling snow in unorganized territory in the winter of nineteen hundred and twenty-two and nineteen hundred and twenty-three the sum of seventy-seven dollars and fifty cents.
