Chapter 16.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Sangerville for Assistance Furnished Fred E. White, State Pauper, in Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Sangerville, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That the town of Sangerville be paid seventy-three dollars and fourteen cents to reimburse it for assistance furnished Fred E. White, state pauper.

Chapter 17.

Resolve, in Favor of Knox Publishing Company, Rockland, for Reimbursement of Primary Advertising in Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-four.

Knox Publishing Co., payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to the Knox Publishing Company for reimbursement of primary advertising in nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of thirty-three dollars.

Chapter 18.

Resolve, in Favor of Ariel Victor Colby and Charlotte May Colby, Minor Children of Victor Colby, on Account of Death of Victor Colby by Accident on the Dexter State Road, June twenty-two, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Victor Colby, heirs of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to Ariel Victor Colby and Charlotte May Colby, minor children of Victor Colby, on account of the death of Victor Colby by accident on the Dexter state road on June twenty-two, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, the sum of three thousand dollars.

Chapter 19.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Durham for Reimbursement for Deficit in Tax Refund for Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Durham, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Durham for reimbursement for deficit in tax refund for nineteen hundred and twenty-three, one hundred and ten dollars and forty-four cents.
