Chapter 20.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Presque Isle to Reimburse It for Money Expended for Support of Noel Bear, Indian.

Presque Isle, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Presque Isle to reimburse it for money expended for support of Noel Bear, an Indian, three hundred and twenty-five dollars.

Approved February 12, 1927.

Chapter 21.

Resolve, in Favor of Raymond Smith, of Stillwater, for Twenty-one Sheep Killed by Dogs in Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one and Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-two.

Raymond Smith, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to Raymond Smith, of Stillwater, for twenty-one sheep killed by dogs in nineteen hundred and twenty-one and nineteen hundred and twenty-two, one hundred and fifty-seven dollars and fifty cents.

Approved February 12, 1927.

Chapter 22.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Kingman for Reimbursement for Supplies Furnished Ed. Priest, State Pauper.

Kingman, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Kingman to reimburse it for support of Ed. Priest, a state pauper, the sum of three hundred twenty-one dollars and fifty cents.

Approved February 12, 1927.

Chapter 23.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Rumford to Reimburse It for Aid to a State Pauper, William Fernald.

Rumford, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be paid to the town of Rumford to reimburse the town for supplies furnished to a state pauper, William Fernald, four hundred sixty-three dollars and twenty-three cents.
