Chapter 30.

Resolve, Authorizing the Governor to Receive from the Secretary of War of the United States Such "Other Funds" Remaining to the Credit of the National Guard of this State and to Distribute Them for the Benefit of Said National Guard.

Governor authorized to receive "Other Funds" as trustee for national guard. Resolved: That whereas, it has been duly made known to the proper authorities of this state that the secretary of war of the United States has in his possession, as trustee, certain moneys known as "Other Funds" which had been collected for their own use and benefit by certain national guard organizations that were broken up as units for or as the result of service in the World War, and have not been reconstituted; and

Whereas, it further appears that the secretary of war, as trustee, desires to turn over to a substitute trustee, duly authorized by this state, such portion of the said funds as equitably belongs to the national guard of this state,

Now therefore, be it resolved by the house of representatives, the senate concurring, that the governor is hereby authorized to receive such funds as trustee, and to distribute them for the benefit of the national guard of this state, in such manner as his judgment shall dictate.

Chapter 31.

Resolve, in Favor of Ward W. Wescott of Ellsworth, for Partial Reimbursement for Expenditures in Proceedings Brought Against Him for His Removal from His Office of Sheriff of Hancock County.

Ward W. Wescott, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated and ordered to be paid to Ward W. Wescott of Ellsworth in the county of Hancock sometime sheriff of the county of Hancock for partial reimbursement to him of moneys expended by him in defense of certain proceedings against him brought by the governor and council to remove him from the office of sheriff, of Hancock county, the sum of eleven hundred seventy-eight dollars.

Chapter 32.

Resolve, Empowering and Directing the Forest Commissioner to Convey a Lot of Land in Wallagrass Plantation.

Forest commissioner authorized to release title to a lot of land. Re-

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solved: That the forest commissioner is hereby empowered and directed to release all the right and interest that the state of Maine may have in and to lot sixteen, in Wallagrass plantation, formerly known as township number seventeen, range seven, west of the east line of the state.

Approved March 9, 1927. (Repealed: See Resolves, Chap. 65.)

Chapter 33.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Athens for Reimbursement for Sheep Killed by Dogs.

Athens, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the town of Athens, in the county of Somerset, for reimbursement, for certain amounts of money paid by it for sheep killed by dogs, the sum of one hundred and one dollars.

Approved March 14, 1927.

Chapter 34.

Resolve, in Favor of Mrs. Daniel Jewett.

Mrs. Daniel Jewett, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid to Mrs. Daniel Jewett, of Skowhegan, in the county of Somerset, for the board of Alfred Smith, the sum of two hundred eighty-five dollars.

Chapter 35.

Resolve, to Reimburse the City of Bath for Support of William A. Griffin, a Former Resident of Malaga Island.

Bath, city of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the city of Bath the sum of two hundred sixty-six dollars and ninety-five cents to reimburse said city for money expended for support of said William A. Griffin, a former resident of Malaga Island.
