RESOLVES

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

As Passed by the Eighty-Third Legislature

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of Maine purchase from the Katahdin Publishing Company or the person or corporation publishing the History of the Town of Dresden by the late Charles E. Allen, one hundred and twenty-five copies of the same when printed at a cost not to exceed the lowest selling price of the work to dealers. Said volumes to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian and that there be and hereby is appropriated and ordered paid for this purpose the sum of one thousand dollars.

Chapter 64.

Resolve, for the Purchase of One Hundred Fifty Copies of "Two American Pioneers."

"Two American Pioneers," to purchase copies of. Resolved: That the state purchase one hundred and fifty copies of the book entitled "Two American Pioneers," written by Mary Alice Wyman, at three dollars per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian; and that there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars.

Chapter 65.

Resolve, to Repeal the Act Empowering the Forest Commissioner to Convey a Lot of Land in Wallagrass Plantation.

Resolves, c. 32, 1927; repealed. Resolved: The resolve entitled "Resolve, that the Forest Commissioner Be Empowered and Directed to Convey a Lot of Land in Wallagrass Plantation," finally passed by this legislature and signed by the governor on March nine, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 66.

Resolve, to Reimburse Cumberland County Fish and Game Association for One-half the Amount Expended in Screening Peabody Pond in the County of Cumberland.

Cumberland County Fish and Game Ass'n, screening Peabody pond. Resolved: That the sum of three hundred and twenty-five dollars be paid from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to the Cumberland County Fish and Game Association

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to reimburse said association for one-half the amount expended from its treasury on account of screening Peabody pond, in the county of Cumberland; said sum to be taken from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

Chapter 67.

Resolve, in Favor of Eliphalet Washburn of Dexter for Pension.

Eliphalet Washburn, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Eliphalet Washburn of Dexter, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 68.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of North Yarmouth.

North Yarmouth, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: There is hereby appropriated the sum of forty-five dollars to reimburse the town of North Yarmouth under and in accordance with the provisions of section one hundred twelve of chapter four of the revised statutes, for money paid by said town on November four, nineteen hundred twenty-six to reimburse Fred Titcomb, an inhabitant of said town, for five lambs, killed by dogs belonging to an unknown owner.

Chapter 69.

Resolve, in Favor of F. C. Handy for Reimbursement for Checks Lost in the Mail.

F. C. Handy, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid to Mr. F. C. Handy of Pownal, to reimburse him for checks lost in the mail, the sum of fifty-eight dollars and seventy-one cents.
