Chapter 78.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Adelbert B. Baker of Lewiston.

Adelbert B. Baker, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Adelbert B. Baker of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 79.

Resolve, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Emily F. Grotton, of Washington.

Emily F. Grotton, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twenty-five dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Emily F. Grotton, of Washington, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

Chapter 80.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Charles Rowe of Brownfield.

Charles Rowe, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Charles Rowe of Brownfield, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.
