Chapter 109.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary Louise Wilcox of Caribou Compensating Her for Personal Injuries.

Louise Wilcox, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of four thousand dollars to reimburse her for personal injury to her, caused by George Stanchfield, on May ninth, nineteen hundred twenty. An inmate at the time of the Bangor State Hospital, for the insane, temporarily allowed his liberty, as provided by statute.

Approved April 6, 1927.

Chapter 110.

Resolve, Appropriating Money to Reimburse the Town of Orland for Support of George Savoy.

Orland, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of eighteen hundred ninety-eight dollars and seventy cents to reimburse the town of Orland for money expended for the support of George Savoy, a pauper, who should be supported by the State.

Approved April 6, 1927.

Chapter 111.

Resolve, to Designate the State Bird.

State bird. Resolved: That the chickadee is hereby declared to be the state bird for the state of Maine.

Approved April 6, 1927.

Chapter 112.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Medway, for Reimbursement of Amount Expended for the Care and Maintenance of Martin Reardon, a Pauper.

Medway, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid to the town of Medway, to reimburse it for the amount expended for the care and maintenance of Martin Reardon, a pauper, the sum of six hundred twenty-four dollars and fifty cents.
