Chapter 128.

Resolve, to Reimburse the Town of Lebanon for Support of Mary Mawson and Child,
State Paupers.

Lebanon, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid the town of Lebanon the sum of ninety-five dollars, to reimburse said town for money expended for support of Mary Mawson and child, state paupers.

Approved April 7, 1927.

Chapter 129.

Resolve, Reimbursing Town of Machiasport for Medical Expenses of Indians.

Machiasport, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of thirty-four dollars and forty-five cents to reimburse the town of Machiasport for medical expenses of Indians.

Approved April 7, 1927.

Chapter 130.

Resolve, to Reimburse the Town of Richmond for Support of Arthur H. Weeks and
Family, State Paupers.

Richmond, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Richmond, the sum of fifty-eight dollars, to reimburse said town for money expended for support of Arthur H. Weeks and family, state paupers, in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Chapter 131.

Resolve, to Reimburse the City of Old Town for Support of George Loring and
Family, Indians.

Old Town, city of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the city of Old Town, the sum of three hundred six dollars and forty-one cents, to reimburse said city for money expended for support of George Loring and family, Indians.
