twenty-nine, the sum of one hundred and thirty-five thousand dollars. Of said sums there shall be applied in each fiscal year for maintenance seventy thousand dollars, for personal services forty-eight thousand five hundred dollars, and for repairs and equipment sixteen thousand five hundred dollars, and for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars shall be applied for the construction of a water tank.

Chapter 138.

Resolve, in Favor of the Northern Maine Sanatorium for Maintenance, Personal Services, Repairs and Equipment.

Northern Maine Sanatorium, for maintenance, etc. Resolved: That the sum of two hundred six thousand dollars be applied for the Northern Maine Sanatorium, one hundred three thousand dollars of said sum to be used during the period commencing July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven and ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight and divided as follows: Thirty-four thousand five hundred dollars for personal services, sixty thousand dollars for maintenance, and eight thousand five hundred dollars for repairs and equipment, and one hundred three thousand dollars of said sum for the period commencing July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight and ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, divided as follows: Thirty-four thousand five hundred dollars for personal services, sixty thousand dollars for maintenance, and eight thousand five hundred dollars for equipment and repairs.

Chapter 139.

Resolve, in Favor of the Central Maine Sanatorium for Maintenance, Personal Services, Repairs and Equipment.

Central Maine Sanatorium, for maintenance, etc. Resolved. That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Central Maine Sanatorium for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, the sum of one hundred forty-six thousand dollars, of which there shall be applied for maintenance eighty-eight thousand dollars, for personal services forty-four thousand dollars, and for repairs and equipment fourteen thousand dollars, and for the fiscal year July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, one hundred and forty-six

thousand dollars, of which there shall be applied for maintenance eighty-eight thousand dollars, for personal services forty-four thousand dollars, and for repairs and equipment fourteen thousand dollars.

Chapter 140.

Resolve, to Reimburse Elliottsville Plantation for Support of John Lynch, a State Pauper.

Elliottsville plantation, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Elliottsville plantation, the sum of five hundred and eight dollars and sixty-five cents, to reimburse said plantation for money expended for support of John Lynch, a state pauper, in nineteen hundred and twenty-four and nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Chapter 141.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Oakland for Money Paid for Mother's Aid.

Oakland, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of four hundred and eighty dollars to reimburse the town of Oakland for money paid during the years nineteen hundred and twenty-five and nineteen hundred and twenty-six for mother's aid for the family of Harry Sabine, a state pauper.

Chapter 142.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Mabel Armstrong, of Lewiston.

Mabel Armstrong, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mabel Armstrong, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.
