Chapter 140.

Resolve, to Reimburse Elliottsville Plantation for Support of John Lynch, a State Pauper.

Elliottsville plantation, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Elliottsville plantation, the sum of five hundred and eight dollars and sixty-five cents, to reimburse said plantation for money expended for support of John Lynch, a state pauper, in nineteen hundred and twenty-four and nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Chapter 141.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Oakland for Money Paid for Mother's Aid.

Oakland, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of four hundred and eighty dollars to reimburse the town of Oakland for money paid during the years nineteen hundred and twenty-five and nineteen hundred and twenty-six for mother's aid for the family of Harry Sabine, a state pauper.

Chapter 142.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Mabel Armstrong, of Lewiston.

Mabel Armstrong, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mabel Armstrong, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 143.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Bertha J. Hodson of Lewiston.

Bertha J. Hodson, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of eight

dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Bertha J. Hodson, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 144.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Nellie Buck of Lewiston.

Nellie Buck, state pension. Resolved. That a pension of eight dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Nellie Buck, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 145.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Sherman to Assist in Support of Pauper.

Sherman, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred twenty-seven and two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred twenty-eight to aid the town of Sherman in support of John Nicholson.

Chapter 146.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Surry.

Kane bridge in Surry, to aid in construction of. Resolved: Any unexpended balance of the sum appropriated by the legislature of nineteen hundred twenty-five, for the rebuilding of Young's Bridge in Surry, be and hereby is, transferred to and appropriated to the reconstruction of the "Kane Bridge," so-called, in the town of Surry, the same to apply to the apportionment under the "bridge act," so-called, to the town of Surry in such reconstruction.
