there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to Opportunity Farm at New Gloucester, for the drilling of an artesian well with which to supply its buildings, the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, the same to be paid to said institution upon its filing proper vouchers with the state auditor.

Chapter 181.

Resolve, in Favor of Procuring Testimonials for the Purpose of Marking the Unmarked Graves of the Soldiers of the Revolutionary War.

Revolutionary soldiers grave markers, appropriation for. Resolved: That the sum of six hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the purpose of procuring testimonials to be used in marking the unmarked graves of the soldiers of the Revolutionary War.

Resolved further: That said sum be paid into the treasury of the Sons of the American Revolution, with which they are hereby authorized to procure and distribute such number of markers as may, from time to time, be required for the purposes herein specified.

Chapter 182.

Resolve, in Favor of Frank R. Chesley, E. W. Blanchard and Gillen & Gillen.

Attorneys in highway investigation, payment of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Frank R. Chesley, the sum of eleven hundred sixty-five dollars for services rendered as attorney in the highway investigation, held before a joint committee, of the eightythird legislature of Maine.

That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to B. W. Blanchard, the sum of eleven hundred sixty-five dollars for services rendered as attorney in the highway investigation, held before a joint committee, of the eighty-third legislature of Maine.

That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Gillen & Gillen, the sum of six hundred thirty-eight dollars and eighty-five cents, for services rendered as attorneys in the highway investigation, held before a joint committee of the eighty-third legislature of Maine.

Said amounts to be paid out of funds appropriated for the use of the eighty-third legislature.
