Resolve, to Reimburse the Town of Webster for Support of Paul Pomeroy and Wife, State Paupers.

**Webster, town of, payment of claim. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Webster, the sum of seventy-four dollars and ninety-six cents, to reimburse said town for money expended for support of Paul Pomeroy and wife, state paupers.

### Chapter 185.

Resolve, in Favor of the Chaplains of the House of the Eighty-third Legislature.

**Chaplains of the house, compensation. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred fifty dollars to be paid to the chaplains of the house of representatives of the eighty-third legislature, in accordance with the list filed with the treasurer of state by the clerk of the house.

### Chapter 186.

Resolve, in Favor of Laurence Mitchell, Representative of the Penobscot Indians to the Eighty-third Legislature.

**Laurence Mitchell, representative Penobscot Indians, compensation. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred sixty-five dollars for attendance, and eighteen dollars for mileage,
