Chapter 253.

Resolve, To Appropriate Money for the Maintenance of State Highway Police.

State highway police, maintenance of. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid out of highway maintenance and administration fund, the sum of one hundred forty thousand dollars for the year from July one, nineteen hundred twenty-seven to June thirty, nineteen hundred twenty-eight, and the sum of one hundred forty thousand dollars for the year from July one, nineteen hundred twenty-eight to June thirty, nineteen hundred twenty-nine, for salary, compensation and clerk hire of the state highway police and for expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.
