further amended by striking out the words, "conduct or maintain a maternity hospital, or;" and by striking out in the ninth line thereof the words, "state board of charities and corrections," and in the eleventh and twelfth lines thereof the words, "state board of charities and corrections," and inserting in place thereof the words, 'department of public welfare,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 58. Must have license from department of public welfare. No person, firm, corporation or association shall conduct or maintain a boarding house or home for three or more children under sixteen years of age, unattended by parents or guardian, excepting children related to such persons by blood or marriage, or who have been legally adopted by such persons, or engage in, or assist in conducting a business of placing out or finding homes or otherwise disposing of children under sixteen years of age, without having in full force a written license therefor from the department of public welfare; provided, that nothing in this section shall apply to any institution, which is or shall come under the supervision of the department of public welfare by the provisions of chapter one hundred and forty-seven.'

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## Chapter 54.

An Act Relating to Amount to be Paid for Clerk Hire in the Office of the Register of Probate for Kennebec County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; as amended; relating to clerk hire in county offices, further amended. Paragraph seven of section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out all of line three of said paragraph in so far as it relates to clerks in the office of register of probate, and inserting in place thereof the words 'twenty-one hundred dollars and said sum shall cover the cost of indexing all documents, papers and records of his office,' so that said paragraph of said section, in so far as it relates to clerks in office of register of probate as amended, shall read as follows:

**Kennebec county increased.** 'for clerks in the office of the register of probate, twenty-one hundred dollars and said sum shall cover the cost of indexing all documents, papers and records of his office.'
