Chapter 58.

An Act Relating to State Juvenile Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 144, sec. 1; relating to trustees of state juvenile institutions, amended. Section one of chapter one hundred and forty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "one woman" in the sixth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'two women,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Board of trustees five men and two women. The government of the state school for boys, established in the city of South Portland, in the county of Cumberland, for the instruction, employment and reform of juvenile offenders, and of the state school for girls, established in Hallowell, in the county of Kennebec, for the education, employment and reform of girls, is vested in a board of trustees, consisting of five men and two women, inhabitants of the state, who shall be known as "Trustees of Juvenile Institutions." The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall annually appoint a member of said board to hold office for a term of six years. Any vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled in like manner for the remainder of the unexpired term. Any trustee may be removed at any time by the governor and council, for cause.'

Chapter 59.

An Act to Open Virginia Lake in Stoneham to Bass Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1927, c. 194, sec. 1; relating to closed time on black bass, amended. Section one of chapter one hundred and ninety-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven is hereby amended by adding in the ninth line thereof, after the word "year" the following: 'and in Virginia lake in Stoneham, in Oxford county, black bass may be taken with artificial flies, fly fishing or by trolling, from the twentieth day of June to the thirtieth day of October in each year,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Virginia lake open from June 20 to Oct. 30 each year. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any black bass in any lake, pond or river in the state from the first day of October of each year until the twentieth day of June of the following year, both days inclusive; provided, however, that in Crawford pond, in Knox county,
