the words "eight hundred" and inserting in place thereof the words 'one thousand' so that said line as amended, shall read as follows:

Knox county increased. 'Knox one thousand dollars.'

Chapter 76.

An Act Relating to the Salary of the County Attorney of Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 37; as amended; relating to compensation of county attorneys, further amended. Section thirty-seven of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in line eleven of said section, after the word "Lincoln" the words "seven hundred dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'one thousand dollars,' so that said eleventh line of said section as amended shall read as follows:

Lincoln county increased. 'Lincoln, one thousand dollars.'

Chapter 77.

An Act Establishing a Game Preserve on Swan Island in Kennebec River, County of Sagadahoc.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Game preserve established on Swan island, Sagadahoc county. No person shall at any time hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within the limits of the following described tract, or territory, situated in Sagadahoc county, to wit: The island in Kennebec river, near Richmond, known as Swan island. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any wild bird, or wild animal, or part thereof, taken within the above described territory.

Sec. 2. Penalties for violations. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than three hundred dollars and costs for each offense, or imprisonment for sixty days, or both said fine and imprisonment.
