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further amended. Section forty-three of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in the eighteenth line thereof after the word "Piscataquis" the word "twelve" and inserting in place thereof the word 'fifteen,' so that said line as amended shall read as follows:

Piscataquis county increased. 'Piscataquis, fifteen hundred dollars.'

Chapter 106.

An Act Relating to the Salary of the Register of Probate of Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 39; relating to compensation of registers of probate, amended. Section thirty-nine of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out in the twentieth line thereof, after the word "Washington" the words "one thousand dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words 'twelve hundred dollars,' so that said twentieth line as amended shall read as follows:

Washington county increased. 'Washington, twelve hundred dollars.'

Chapter 107.

An Act Relating to Voters in Unincorporated Places and on Islands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 7, sec. 74; relating to electors in unincorporated islands and places, amended. Section seventy-four of chapter seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence of said section and inserting in place thereof the following: 'And such electors so presenting their polls and estates may vote in such town for all national, state and county officers and representatives to the legislature,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 74. May vote for all national, state and county officers and representatives to the legislature. Electors living on islands adjacent to the mainland along the coast of the state and within the jurisdiction thereof, but not incorporated with any town, and all such electors living in other unorganized places may furnish lists of their polls and estates to the assessors of any adjacent town, on or before the first day of each April, and said assessors shall assess state and county taxes upon all such persons, and they shall be collected in the same manner and by the same officers as

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if such electors were inhabitants of such town. And such electors so presenting their polls and estates may vote in such town for all national, state and county officers and representatives to the legislature.'

Chapter 108.

An Act to Increase the Compensation for Clerk Hire in the Office of Waldo County Register of Deeds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; P. L., 1921, c. 219; P. L., 1923, c. 95; relating to clerk hire in county offices, amended. Paragraph fifteen of section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, as amended by chapter ninety-five of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "fourteen hundred and four" in the second line of said paragraph, and inserting in place thereof the words 'fifteen hundred and sixty,' so that said paragraph, as amended, shall read as follows:

Waldo county increased. 'Waldo County: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, fifteen hundred and sixty dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, two hundred dollars; for clerks in the office of the clerk of courts, five hundred dollars.'

Chapter 109.

An Act Regulating the Catching of Smelts in the Waters of Casco Bay and Mouth of the Presumpscot River in Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Catching of smelts in Casco bay regulated. It shall be unlawful for any person at any time to catch smelts in the waters of Casco bay above and to the north of Martin's Point bridge so called, except by the ordinary method of hook and line.

Sec. 2. Penalty for violations. Whoever violates the provisions of this act shall be liable to a fine of not more than fifty dollars for each offense upon conviction.
