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## Chapter 127.

An Act Relating to Teachers' Pensions.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 16, sec. 169; P. L., 1923, c. 200; P. L., 1927, c. 41; relating to persons who shall receive a teacher's pension of \$400, amended. Section one hundred and sixty-nine of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, as amended by chapter forty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven is hereby amended by striking out after the word "of" in line fourteen the word "four" and inserting the word 'five,' so that the section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 169. Amount of pension increased to \$500. Any person of either sex who, on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred thirteen, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for thirty-five years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal occupation, and who shall have been employed as a teacher or teacher and supervisor in the public schools, or in such other schools within this state as are supported wholly or at least three-fifths by state or town appropriation and are under public management and control, twenty years of which employment, including the fifteen years immediately preceding retirement, shall have been in this state, and who shall be retired by his employer or shall voluntarily retire from active service after completion of the school year next preceding the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred thirteen, shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of five hundred dollars; provided, however, that after the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred thirteen, no such employment as teacher within this state shall be included in its provisions unless the teacher shall hold a state teachers' certificate issued under authority of the state superintendent of public schools.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 16, sec. 170; P. L., 1925, c. 36, sec. 1; P. L., 1927, c. 41, sec. 2; relating to person who may receive a teacher's pension of \$325, amended. Section one hundred and seventy of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes as amended by section one of chapter thirty-six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-five, as amended by section two of chapter forty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven is hereby amended by striking out after the words "pension of" in line seven the words "three hundred twenty-five dollars" and inserting therein the words 'three hundred and seventy-five dollars,' so that the section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 170. Amount of pension increased to \$375. Any person of either

sex, who, on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for thirty years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal occupation and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of the preceding section shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of three hundred and seventy-five dollars.'

Sec. 3. R. S., c. 16, sec. 171; P. L., 1925, c. 36, sec. 2; P. L., 1927, c. 41, sec. 3; relating to persons who may receive a teacher's pension of \$250, amended. Section one hundred and seventy-one of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes as amended by section two of chapter thirty-six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-five, as amended by section three of chapter forty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven is hereby amended by striking out after the words "pension of" in lines seven and eight the words "two hundred fifty dollars" and inserting therein the words 'two hundred and seventy-five dollars,' so that the section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 171. Amount of pension increased to \$275. Any person of either sex who, on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, or thereafter, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for twenty-five years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal occupation, and who shall have in all other respects met the requirements of section one hundred and sixty-nine shall, on his formal application, receive from the state for the remainder of his life an annual pension of two hundred and seventy-five dollars.'

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## Chapter 128.

An Act Relative to the County Commissioners of Penobscot County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 117, sec. 42; relating to compensation of county commissioners, further amended. Section forty-two of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "twelve hundred dollars" in the fourteenth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'seventeen hundred and fifty dollars,' so that said fourteenth line of said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Penobscot county increased. 'Penobscot, seventeen hundred and fifty dollars.'
