## Chapter 11.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Blue Hill Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Charter extended.** The rights, powers and privileges granted by chapter forty of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Blue Hill Water Company" are hereby extended for a term of two years from the time when the same would otherwise expire.

## Chapter 12.

An Act Confirming and Making Valid Certain Licenses or Permits Given by the Selectmen of Hancock, Maine, and Vesting in the Consolidated Lobster Company, Inc., Certain Rights and Property in Lobster Pounds, Wharf and Dams in the Waters of Skillings River on the West Side of Hancock Point in Hancock, Maine.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Sec. 1. Licenses ratified and made valid.** The licenses or permits dated February twenty-three, nineteen hundred and eleven and June twenty-six, nineteen hundred and twenty-two respectively, granted to J. W. Stinson and J. W. Stinson and Son respectively, relating to the erecting and maintaining a lobster pound, wharf and dams in the waters of Skillings river on the west side of Hancock Point in Hancock, Maine, and the assignments, dated December five, nineteen hundred and twenty-eight relating to said licenses or permits, from said J. W. Stinson (John W. Stinson) and said John W. Stinson and Calvin L. Stinson individually and as co-partners as J. W. Stinson and Son, to the Consolidated Lobster Company, Inc., a corporation organized under the laws of the commonwealth of Massachusetts and having its principal office or place of business at Boston, county of Suffolk, in said commonwealth, are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

**Sec. 2. Rights to pounds, wharf, etc., granted.** The said Consolidated Lobster Company, Inc., its successors and assigns, are hereby granted the right to maintain and use, the lobster pounds, wharf, dams and structures in the waters of Skillings river on the west side of Hancock Point in

Hancock, Maine, as the same have been maintained and used by said John W. Stinson, said Calvin L. Stinson or said J. W. Stinson and Son or any one or more of them.

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### Chapter 13.

An Act Relating to the Home for Aged Men in Bangor.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

P. & S. L., 1893, c. 557, sec. 2; P. & S. L., 1905, c. 251; relating to holding of property, further amended. Section two of chapter five hundred fifty-seven of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-three as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby further amended by striking out the words "two hundred and fifty" in the fourth and fifth lines of said section, and inserting in the place thereof the words 'five hundred' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Amount increased to \$500,000. Under the above name, said corporation may sue and be sued, take by purchase, devise, or otherwise, real and personal property and hold the same for the purposes expressed in section one, to an amount not exceeding five hundred thousand dollars, and manage and dispose of the same for the purposes aforesaid; and shall possess all the rights, privileges and immunities, which belong to corporations created for charitable objects, under the laws of this state.'

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### Chapter 14.

An Act to Incorporate the Great Pond Railway Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. Corporators; corporate name; powers. James Q. Gulnac of Bangor, Maine, Henry Patton of Rensselaer, New York, Isaiah K. Stetson, H. Eugene Collett, Charles H. Bartlett, Allan W. McLean, Henry Prentiss and Donald F. Snow, all of said Bangor, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of Great Pond Railway Company, with all the powers, rights and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions and obligations provided in the general laws respecting railroads, not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

Sec. 2. Authorized to construct and operate railroad for transportation of freight and forest products only. Subject to the provisions of chapter
