Chapter 128.

An Act to Appropriate Moneys for the Expenditures of the Government and for Other Purposes for the Year from July First, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-nine to June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations July 1, 1929, to July 1, 1930. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of moneys from the state treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes, for the current fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, and except where otherwise specially provided, the governor with the advice of the council, is hereby

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authorized at any time prior to the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.

Chapter 129.

An Act to Appropriate Moneys for the Expenditures of the Government and for Other Purposes for the Year from July First, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty to June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-one.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations July 1, 1930, to July 1, 1931. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of moneys from the state treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes, for the current fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and thirty to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury, and except where otherwise specially provided, the governor with the advice of the council, is hereby authorized at any time between the first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty and the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, to draw his warrant on the state treasurer for the same.
