Chapter 6.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Kate D. Talbot of Machias.

Kate D. Talbot, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of eight dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Kate D. Talbot, of Machias, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Approved February 22, 1929.

Chapter 7.

Resolve, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Sarah Perkins of Harmony.

Sarah Perkins, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of fifteen dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Sarah Perkins, of Harmony, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

Approved February 22, 1929.

Chapter 8.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Alberta Wadsworth of Belfast.

Alberta Wadsworth, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Alberta Wadsworth, of Belfast, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Approved February 22, 1929.

Chapter 9.

Resolve, in Favor of the Waldo and Penobscot Agricultural Society, for the State Stipend for Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-eight.

Waldo and Penobscot Agricultural Society, state stipend. Resolved: That there be paid to the Waldo and Penobscot Agricultural Society, from the nineteen hundred and twenty-nine appropriation for aid to agricultural societies and fairs, the sum of two hundred and seven dollars.
