Chapter 53.

Resolve, Providing for a State Pension for Alice M. Whitten of Albion.

Alice M. Whitten, state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Alice M. Whitten of Albion, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 54.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Peru.

Peru, town of, appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of three thousand dollars to aid the town of Peru in the alteration of the crossing of the Maine Central Railroad and state highway "C," between the village of East Peru and the Canton town line, the work to be done as provided in section thirty-four of chapter twenty-four of the revised statutes, as amended, this money to be paid from the funds for road reconstruction.

Chapter 55.

Resolve, for the Purchase of One Hundred Copies of "Sketches of Brooks History."

"Sketches of Brooks History," purchase of copies. Resolved: That the state purchase one hundred copies of the book entitled "Sketches of Brooks History" written by Seth W. Norwood, at five dollars per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian; and that there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of five hundred dollars.
