Chapter 53.

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in the Big Magalloway River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Entrance to Azischohos lake designated. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game is authorized and directed to place two red posts on opposite banks of the big Magalloway river at the point where said river enters into Azischohos lake, said posts to be set at the high water mark of Azischohos lake.

Approved March 20, 1931.

Chapter 54.

AN ACT Prohibiting the Shooting of Wild Birds and Waterfowl on Simpson's Pond, in Roque Bluffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Shooting of wild birds and waterfowl prohibited on Simpson's Pond. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill, any wild bird or waterfowl on Simpson's Pond, or from the shores of said pond, which pond is situated in the town of Roque Bluffs, in the county of Washington.

Sec. 2. Possession of birds taken prohibited. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any wild bird or waterfowl taken in violation of the provisions of this act.

Sec. 3. Penalty for violations. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.

Chapter 55.

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Swift River Tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, sec. 21, relating to fishing in Bradeen stream, west branch and Walker brook, amended. Section twenty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the one hundred tenth line of the thirty-fourth paragraph thereof, after the words

CHAP. 58

"Walker brook" the words 'situated in the counties of Franklin and Oxford,' so that the reference to Swift river tributaries, in lines one hundred nine to one hundred thirteen inclusive of the thirty-fourth paragraph of said section twenty-one shall read as follows: 'Bradeen Stream West Branch (1929, c. 354), and Walker brook, situated in the counties of Franklin and Oxford, and the respective tributaries to each in the towns of Byron, Roxbury, and Mexico, and which flow into Swift river in Oxford county, before July thirteen, nineteen hundred thirty-four;'

Chapter 56.

AN ACT to Close Duck Pond, Known as Meeting House Pond, and Sprague's Pond, in Phippsburg, to Ice Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, sec. 21, relating to ice fishing in Duck Pond, known as Meeting House Pond, and Sprague's Pond, in Phippsburg, amended. Section twenty-one of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end of the twentieth paragraph of said section the following: 'Duck Pond, known as Meeting House Pond, and Sprague's Pond, in Phippsburg, in Sagadahoc county.'

Approved March 20, 1931.

Chapter 57.

AN ACT Closing the Tributaries of Thomas Pond to all Fishing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Tributaries to Thomas Pond closed. All tributaries to Thomas Pond, so called, in the towns of Casco and Raymond, in the county of Cumberland, are closed to all fishing.

Approved March 20, 1931.

Chapter 58.

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Round Mountain Lake.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Fishing in Round Mountain Lake. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill, any kind of fish at any time, in Round
