Sec. 2. Repealing clause. All acts, rules and regulations inconsistent with the preceding section are hereby repealed.

Chapter 179.

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in County Offices.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, sec. 46; relating to clerk hire in county offices, amended. Section forty-six of chapter one hundred twenty-five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the second line of the twelfth paragraph of said section, relating to Piscataquis county, the word "three" and inserting in place thereof the word 'four', so that said paragraph as amended shall read as follows:

Piscataquis increased. 'Piscataquis county: for clerks in the office of the register of deeds, eight hundred eighty-four dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, four hundred dollars; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, eight hundred eighty-four dollars.'

Chapter 180.

AN ACT Providing That the Governor May Suspend Open Season for Hunting and Fishing in Time of Drought.

Emergency Preamble. Whereas, the law authorizing the governor to suspend the fishing and the hunting season by reason of drought, does not accomplish the intent of its purpose and places a hardship on some localities and camp owners, and

Whereas, the foregoing facts render the passage of this act immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety, and constitutes an emergency within the meaning of the constitution, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 11, sec. 38; relating to suspension of open season, amended. Section thirty-eight of chapter eleven of the revised statutes
