As Passed by the Eighty-Fifth
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Sec. 2. Androscoggin law library; maintenance during 1932. The treasurer of the county of Androscoggin shall pay during the year nineteen hundred thirty-two to the treasurer of the trustees of the law library in the county of Androscoggin in addition to the annual sum provided by statute the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the purchase of books for said law library and to provide for the general up-keep, enlargement and betterment of said library.

Chapter 14.

AN ACT Relating to Certified Copies of Certain Records in County of Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Aroostook county records of deeds for the southern division, volumes 2, 3, 4, 6, 9, 10 and 12 to be copied. The register of deeds for the county of Aroostook at Houlton is hereby authorized and empowered to make a true copy of the contents of volumes two, three, four, six, nine, ten and twelve of the Aroostook county records of deeds at Houlton, and to certify that the same is a true copy of said records.

Sec. 2. Copied volumes to be received in courts with same legal effect as originals. When said copies are so made and certified the records contained therein and certified copies made therefrom shall be received in all courts of law with the same legal effect as those contained in the original volumes.

Sec. 3. Compensation for services and expenses in copying. Compensation for such services and expenses shall be fixed by the county commissioners of said county, and upon order therefor by them shall be paid by the county treasurer.

Chapter 15.

AN ACT to Extend the Charter Granted to the Union Terminal Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1927, c. 69; relative to incorporation of Union Terminal Company; charter extended. The act of incorporation of the Union Terminal Company being chapter sixty-nine of the private and special laws

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of nineteen hundred twenty-seven and the charter granted thereby and extended by chapter twenty-three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred twenty-nine are hereby extended for two years from the date when the same would otherwise expire by law, with the same force and effect in all respects as if said incorporation were hereby granted.

Chapter 16.

AN ACT Relating to the Right of Warren Memorial Foundation to Hold Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Warren Memorial Foundation; authority to hold property. Warren Memorial Foundation, a charitable corporation duly organized and existing is hereby authorized to take and hold real and personal estate and donations, grants, devises or bequests to the amount of one million dollars.

Chapter 17.

AN ACT Additional to the Acts Which Constitute the Charter of Colby College, Formerly Colby University.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1813, c. CXXXI, sec. 4; relating to the establishing of a literary institution in Maine. That section four of chapter CXXXI, enacted by the senate and house of representatives in general court assembled of the commonwealth of Massachusetts and approved by the governor February twenty-seven, eighteen hundred thirteen, entitled: "An act to establish a literary institution in the district of Maine within this commonwealth" is amended by striking out, in section four of said act, the words, "by the name of the President and Corporation of the Maine Literary and Theological Institution" and inserting in place thereof the words 'by the name of the President and Trustees of Colby College' and by striking out at the end of said section the words "Provided, nevertheless, that the annual clear income of the same shall not exceed the sum of thirty thousand dollars", so that said section, as amended, will read:

'Sec. 4. Powers of corporation. Be it further enacted, That the said corporation may have one common seal, which they may change, break,
