preceding such elections, the first two days thereof to be devoted to registration of voters, and the last day to enable the board to verify the corrections of said lists and to complete and close up their records of said sessions. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the act to incorporate the City of Belfast School District be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross placed over the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. The result in said district shall be declared by the municipal officers of the city of Belfast and due certificate filed by the city clerk with the secretary of state.

Chapter 61.**AN ACT Relating to Liability for Support of a Pauper in the Town of Gouldsboro.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Release of certain pauper claims against Gouldsboro. The state of Maine shall, and hereby does, release any and all claims that it may have against the town of Gouldsboro in the matter of Theodore Davis, a pauper.

Chapter 62.**AN ACT to Change the Names of Certain Waters in Piscataquis County.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1913, c. 64, repealed. Chapter sixty-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred thirteen is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. Certain waters renamed. The names of the following waters in Piscataquis County are hereby changed, as indicated below.

1. The name of Kokadjo river is hereby changed to Roach river.
2. The name of First Kokadjo lake is hereby changed to First Roach pond.
3. The name of Second Kokadjo lake is hereby changed to Second Roach pond.
4. The name of Third Kokadjo lake is hereby changed to Third Roach pond.

5. The name of Fourth Kokadjo lake is hereby changed to Fourth Roach pond.

Chapter 63.

AN ACT to Enable Special Officers of Bangor Police to Receive Benefits of Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Special officers of Bangor given pension rights. William F. Banks and Levi E. Lambert who have served as special officers of the Bangor police force for seventeen and thirteen years respectively are, and shall be, entitled to all and the same rights, privileges, pensions and benefits under the laws and ordinances relating to the Bangor police department as any regular member.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This act shall not take effect until approved by the board of aldermen of the city of Bangor.

Chapter 64.

AN ACT to Amend and Extend the Charter of Kennebec Reservoir Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1929, c. 96, sec. 2; relating to removal of stumpage, amended. Section seven of chapter one hundred thirteen of the private and special acts of nineteen hundred twenty-seven as amended by section two of chapter ninety-six of the private and special acts of nineteen hundred twenty-nine is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence of the second paragraph of said section and inserting in the place of said sentence so stricken out the following: 'This corporation shall, within four years from the commencement of flowage, cut and remove all trees, bushes and stumps on the area flowed or to be flowed to such an extent that all such trees, bushes and stumps left on the flowed area shall be at least eight feet below the surface of the mean low water level maintained during the period beginning June first and ending December first next following of each year, but in no case shall it be required to remove stumps below the swell of the roots.'
