Chapter 116.

AN ACT to Legalize Meetings Held by the Sea and Shore Fisheries Commission Since the Expiration of the Terms, for Which They Were Appointed, of One or More of Them, and to Make Valid Any Findings That They May Have Rendered as a Result of Same.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Validation of sea and shore fisheries commission's meetings. All meetings which have been held by the sea and shore fisheries commission, when all three members of the commission and its director have been present, are hereby made legal, even though the term of one or more of them should have expired, and any decisions that they have rendered as a result of such meetings shall be valid.

Chapter 117.

AN ACT Authorizing and Empowering the Town of Islesboro to Raise Money to Provide and Maintain Transportation Facilities by Boat for Passengers and Freight.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Islesboro authorized to raise money for certain purpose. The town of Islesboro is hereby authorized and empowered to raise money to provide and maintain such transportation facilities for passengers and freight by boat as may, in the judgment of the municipal authorities, be found necessary for the welfare of the inhabitants of said town.

Chapter 118.

AN ACT To Abolish the Common Council of the City of Biddeford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. and S. L., 1855, c. 2; P. and S. L., 1862, c. 170, sec. 1; relating to incorporation of the city of Biddeford, further amended. Chapter two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred fifty-five is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth and fifth lines thereof the words "and one council of twenty-one to be denominated the common
