Sec. 3. Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 132.

AN ACT to Authorize the Construction of a Wharf in Long Lake at Naples.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Wharf on Long Lake authorized. Augustus F. Bove of Naples, his assigns, executors and heirs are hereby authorized and empowered to construct and maintain a wharf opposite land owned by him in Long Lake in the town of Naples and the county of Cumberland, his said land being located between the Casino property and the bridge, and to extend the same into said Long Lake for a distance of not more than one hundred feet from the shore of the lake at low water mark.

No building shall be erected on said wharf and no part of the wharf shall extend above the level of the adjacent highway. The wharf shall be maintained in good condition for the free use of the public. The opening in the guard rail on the bridge leading to the wharf shall not exceed ten feet in width. The wharf and approach shall not cover more than twenty-five hundred square feet of area.

If the said wharf is not built before January one, nineteen hundred thirty-three, this act shall become void.

Chapter 133.

AN ACT to Provide for the Reconstruction or Enlargement of the International Bridge at Calais, in the County of Washington, known as the Ferry Point Bridge.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Reconstruction of "International Bridge" at Calais provided for. The state highway commission is hereby authorized and directed

to use out of the proceeds of the sale or issue of bridge bonds issued under the provisions of chapter one hundred and thirty of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred twenty-nine, such sum as may be necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars to reconstruct or enlarge the American end or half of the International Bridge at Calais, in the county of Washington, connecting the state of Maine with the province of New Brunswick and known generally as the Ferry Point Bridge, to meet such reconstruction or enlargement as may be undertaken on the Canadian end or half of said bridge by the proper authorities having jurisdiction and control over said Canadian end or half.

Sec. 2. Conditions to be met. The authority granted in this act is conditional upon an appropriation being made by the proper authorities for the reconstruction or enlargement of the Canadian end or half of the bridge aforesaid and is also conditional upon plans for reconstruction or enlargement of said bridge being agreed upon between said state highway commission and the proper Canadian authorities.

Chapter 134.

AN ACT Relating to City Committees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1899, c. 199; P. & S. L., 1917, c. 98; relating to city committees, further amended. Section one of chapter one hundred ninety-nine of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-nine, as amended by chapter ninety-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred seventeen, is hereby further amended by striking out all of said section and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sec. 1. Modified to conform to primary law. Any political party in the city of Biddeford, entitled to choose delegates to the state convention of such party, shall at the caucus named to choose such delegates to said state convention, elect its city committee, and committees chosen at other times shall have no power or authority for calling any ward or city caucuses. The committee so chosen shall hold office for the term of two years from the date of their election.'
