Chapter 10.

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Maria E. Collins, of Chelsea.

Maria E. Collins; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of thirty dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Maria E. Collins, of Chelsea, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin January first, nineteen hundred thirty-one, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 11.

RESOLVE, for State Pension in Favor of Rena Cooley, of Augusta.

Rena Cooley; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of three hundred dollars per year be, and hereby is, granted to Rena Cooley of Augusta for the benefit of herself and minor children, Violet and Evelyn, to begin July first, nineteen hundred thirty-one, and to continue until otherwise ordered by the legislature.
