Chapter 23.

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Amounts Due Exhibitors at the Central Maine Fair Association in Nineteen Hundred Twenty-nine, on Account of State Stipend.

Central Maine Fair Association, state stipend. Resolved: That there be paid to Victor Grange and one hundred forty-eight other exhibitors at the Central Maine Fair Association in nineteen hundred twenty-nine the sum of nine hundred twenty-nine dollars and eighty-eight cents being the amount the state of Maine would have paid said association had said association complied with all provisions of section twenty-five of chapter thirty-nine of the revised statutes. Said sum to be distributed among such exhibitors by the commissioner of agriculture in accordance with the amounts awarded them in premiums upon live-stock, agricultural and domestic products but not paid by said society.

Chapter 24.

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Harold E. Trueworthy of Athens.

Harold E. Trueworthy; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be, and hereby is, granted to Harold E. Trueworthy, of Athens, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hundred thirty-one, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Approved March 16, 1931.

Chapter 25.

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Danforth.

Town of Danforth, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of three hundred forty dollars and ninety-eight
